UNIFORM

HEALTH NEWS

ASTHMA PLANS

This year the College is due to renew its Asthma Friendly School Status.

RESEARCH

YEAR 11

The Year 11 Health and Physical Education students are doing some excellent work, planning a large program for the College. We have received nearly \$3,000. They are planning and conducting a Rural Living Skills Program for the three local primary schools.

The program will focus on safety and wellbeing in a rural community.

YEAR 10

The Year 10s will be doing some lessons with me about sexual health, early next term. The lessons will focus on positive relationships, their emerging attitudes and decision making strategies. An information sheet will be sent home with your student. I encourage you to talk to your child about your attitudes and expectations around sexual relationships.

YEARS 8 & 9

Earlier in the term our Community Health Nurses and Social Worker Lee Fox conducted a friendship session with the Year 8 girls. This is the start of the relationship and resilience program. The Year 8 & 9 boys will also be working on friendships and self esteem early in Term 3. During adolescence actual developmental tasks need to be reached. They relate to identity and independence. Adolescence can be a time of conflict with parents and friends. These relationships are very significant to the young person so conflicts in this area can be a big deal to the young person at the time. If you have concerns about your young person please contact the College at any time.

YEAR 6

The Year 6 class will be having some lessons with me on Puberty. Please see the article in next week's newsletter, "Playing the Puberty Game." The holidays would be a good time to have some discussion with your child about the physical and emotional changes puberty brings. All the research shows that talking about the easier "stuff" means your child is more likely to come to you with bigger issues and problems later on.

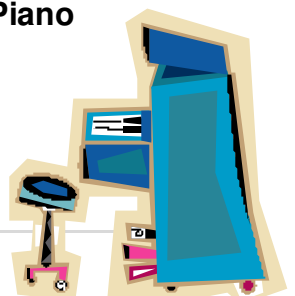
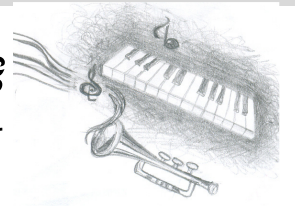

STORMS

WIND SOCKS

We tested them outside but there wasn't much wind so they didn't really work. The second time we tested them there was some wind so they worked. It was fun making our wind socks!

Year 3/4 is learning about wind and you can tell which way the wind is going by the trees and a wind sock.

HOW TO MAKE A KITE

Step 1. Get a paper plate and colour it in.

Step 2. Get 10 ribbons and staple them on.

Step 3. Get a stick and string and rap the string around the stick and staple it on the plate.

That's how you do it.
